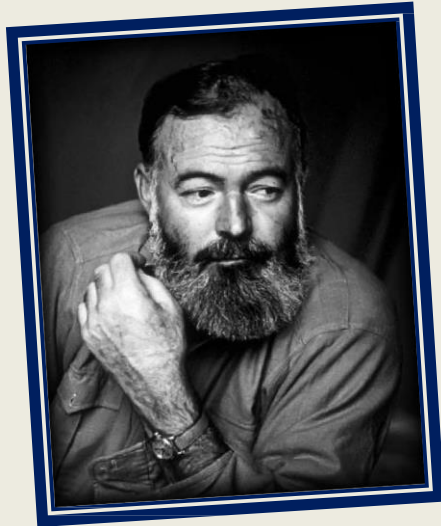

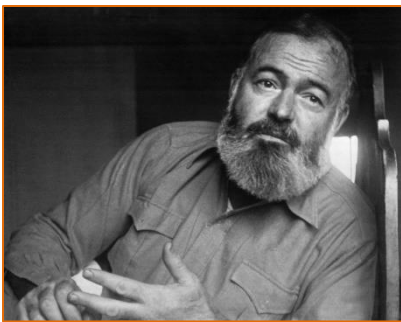

## **ERNEST HEMINGWAY - INTERESTING FACTS FROM THE BIOGRAPHY**

**Hell of luck. I will bring luck with me.**  
**(Ernest Hemingway)**



Ernest Hemingway (1899-1961) - writer, novelist and journalist. Hemingway's novels are about strong and courageous people who achieve their goals against all odds. His characters are people who know how to love, to worry, but along with that, they have something extraordinary. Probably because the author himself is a unique and extraordinary person. So let's

recall interesting and unusual moments from the life of the outstanding writer.

Hemingway's works are mainly written in the style of modernism and realism. Modernism and realism prevail in his works. Ernest grew up and was brought up in a wealthy family: his father was a prosperous doctor, and his mother worked as an opera singer.

Well, let's move on to curiosities from his life!

Continuing to talk about the family, it turns out that Hemingway never loved his mother. Maybe because of being still a child, Hemingway's mother often dressed him in girls' clothes. Moreover, the boy had his hair cut for the first time when he was already 6 years old. But his father began to teach him hunting and fishing when the future writer was only 4 years old.

The next thing that surprised me was that as a child, Ernest's parents forced him to learn to play the cello, despite the fact the boy had no musical abilities. Of course, when a child is forced to do what he does not want- it is unfortunate!

Well, let's continue!

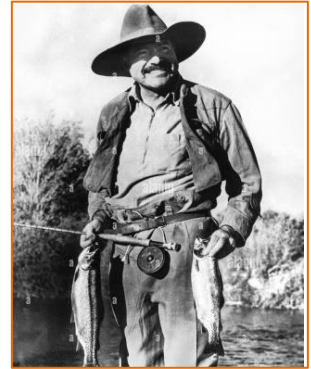
The writer was named after his maternal grandfather. This is probably why Hemingway was very attached to his grandfather, who even gave his 12-year-old grandson a hunting rifle.

It is an interesting fact that at the beginning of the First World War (1914-1918), Hemingway volunteered for the front, but due to problems with his left eye, he was declared unfit for service. Nevertheless, Ernest Hemingway was still able to participate in the war as a driver for the Red Cross.

Hemingway's life, as it turned out, was filled not only with interesting but also with sad events: there were many cases when he was on the verge of life and death. He was involved in road accidents more than 10 times, was wounded 2 times while hunting, and in one of the battles he was wounded by 273 mortar fragments at once. Hemingway limped on one leg because his kneecap was shattered by a bullet and replaced with a prosthesis. At the height of the Second World War (1939-1945), Ernest Hemingway met Exupery, who was then engaged not only in writing, but also served as a military pilot.

And this interesting fact is really extraordinary!

Ernest Hemingway was famous for using a machine gun to scare off sharks while fishing. In 1938, he set a world record by catching 7 marlins in one day. Hemingway also spent a significant amount of time from the summer of 1942 to the end of 1943 patrolling the coastal waters of Cuba in his wooden fishing boat. There was radio direction finding equipment on the boat, and the writer was trying to detect German submarines.



The next fascinating point is that Ernest Hemingway had an enviable fearlessness and courage. For example, he participated in a bullfight, was not afraid to enter a cage with lions and once entered the ring against the American boxing champion.

An interesting fact is that Ernest Hemingway was crazy about cats, of which he had more than 20! The episode when he was forced to shoot his cat, which was hit by a car, became one of the most difficult in his life.

And now let's talk about his literary activity!

For the first time, Ernest engaged in writing activities in his youth, when he wrote articles for the school newspaper.

There is a well-known case when Ernest won a bet, having managed to write the shortest and most touching story consisting of only 6 words: "Children's shoes are for sale. Unworn" (in the original - "For sale: baby shoes, never worn").

Fans of the writer's work gave him an affectionate nickname - "Papa Ham".

In 1954, Hemingway was awarded the Nobel Prize in Literature for the novel "The Old Man and the Sea".

A small planet discovered in 1978 was named after the writer.

Ernest Hemingway distrusted the praise of literary critics and admirers of his work. In the last years of his life, the writer was in severe depression, which was accompanied by persecution mania. Hemingway was locked up in a psychiatric hospital, trying to cure him with electric shocks. This led to the fact that he partially lost his memory and could no longer engage in literature.

In 1961, at the age of 61, Hemingway took his own life by shooting himself with his gun, as his father had once done.

Of course, this is sadder than interesting, but the fact - Hemingway's father, sister, and brother also committed suicide.

Perhaps there are some more unusual facts from the writer's life, but I will leave it as a motivation for the next study!
